III - WRFA BUDGET

2022 BUDGET SUMMARY & FINANCIAL POSITION

SHORT TERM

WRFA is well positioned financially for the short-term for both regular staffing as well as contract/specialty staffing, due largely to our status as a recipient of the **Corporation for Public Broadcasting's** (CPB) annual Community Service Grant – which saw an increase in 2022 - as well as receiving CPB CARES Act funding in 2020 along with CPB American Rescue Plan Stabilization Funding in 2021.

Also, with the pandemic slowing down, WRFA in 2022 is also once again received full **BOCES COSER** funding to cover the cost of in-class instruction at Jamestown High School. This funding is responsible for covering the majority of the cost of the Station Manager position, which is ineligible for any CPB funding.

WRFA in 2022 has also seen modest increases in several **Community Support** categories - including **Corporate Support** (business underwriting), **Event Fundraising,** and **Foundation Support** - from 2021 to 2022, but **Individual Donations** have so far seen a slight decrease.

LONG TERM

Over the long-term, WRFA will have to plan for significant increases in all Community Support categories in order to maintain its core staffing (Station Manager, Public Affairs, Program Coordinator). This will need to occur in 2024 and 2025. As previously mentioned, WRFA will lose its CPB status by the end of 2023 due to an adjustment its formula used to determine eligibility for annual CSG payments. The 2023 CSG payment – combined with income from the CPB ARPA and CARES Act funds – should help to ensure funding is in place by the middle to end of 2024. However, most if not all will be spent by 2025.

As a result of the future loss of CPB funds, WRFA is working on strategies to raise additional money to offset any losses associated with CPB. RLCA has hired a Development Director and they will be working with us to help with our long-term development plans not related to CBP, including developing a Membership Model to increase Individual Donations, along with identifying alternative grant funding from various local, regional and national sources.

SUPPORTING RLCA GENERAL OPERATIONS IN 2021

Also worth noting – a one-time \$17,000 allocation from the **NYS Shuddered Venues Operators Grant** (SVOG) received by RLCA was used to cover much of the cost of the WRFA Station Manager position in 2021. WRFA also received **2021 Foundation Support** (NY Humanities grant, Holmberg Foundation) that was used to help cover the cost of the Station Manager position. As a result, much of the money raised in the **Community Support Categories** (Corporate Underwriting, Individual Donations, and Fundraising) was not needed to cover the Station Manager Position, nor for any other costs associated with station operations due to the unprecedented level of CBP funding. This resulted in an End of Year Surplus of approximately \$26,000 in unrestricted funding, which did not carry over for the radio station in 2022 and instead was used to support RLCA General Operations. A smaller allocation is also expected at the end of this budget year.




